The 229th Anniversary of the Battle of Kings Mountain, Wednesday, October 7, 2009 at 11:00 a.m., Kings Mountain National Military Park, Kings Mountain, South Carolina.

SAR, DAR, CAR, SR societies and chapters are invited to participate in the grave marking at 2:00 p.m. 6 October 2009 and the formal wreath laying ceremony at the National Military Park's US Monument beginning at 11:00 a.m on 7 October 2009. A traditional commemoration program in the park's amphitheater begins at 3:00 p.m 7 October 2009. Participants desiring to present a wreath at the grave site must deliver it prior to 2:00 p.m. at the grave site. Participants desiring to present a wreath at the US Monument must deliver it to the park's Visitor Center not later than 9:00 a.m., October 7th, to label and transport them to the ceremony site. Ground transportation will be provided for those needing special care. All compatriots are encouraged to wear period dress (Continental or Militia). Wreaths may be dedicated to a specific organization, individual patriot or compatriot. The grave marking is particularly important as Col Hambright is the ancestor of President General Nominee Ed Butler who will be attending both ceremonies, so please indicate by check mark in the space indicated. It is hoped that many will be present in colonial uniform at both events. On 6 October 2009, please be at the grave site at the Kings Mountain Presbyterian Church at 1:30 p.m. Following that program there will be a South Atlantic District Meeting at the Super 8 Motel in Gaffney, SC for State Presidents and General Officers chaired by VPG Sam Powell.

The NCSSAR will host a cocktail hour at 5:00 p.m. on 6 October for SAR members and guests. The SCSSAR will host breakfast in the Super 8 Motel for all SAR members and guests on 7 Oct 2009.

Directions to the Old Shilo Presbyterian Church Cemetery: From Charlotte, take I-85 South to Kings Mountain, NC. Then turn toward Grover. The cemetery is one mile east of Grover and lies about four hundred feet south of the old York Road, now named Elm. At this point, a few feet from the bridge over I-85, there is an unpaved road on the south side which leads to the cemetery.

Directions to Kings Mountain National Military Park: Kings Mountain National Military Park is located on South Carolina Highway 216. From Greenville, SC travel on I-85 North to NC #2. From Charlotte, NC travel on I-85 South to NC Exit #2.
