The Cincinnati Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (S. A. R.) is sponsoring a Memorial Service for Revolutionary War Veteran Christopher Hartman at the Hartman Cemetery Grave Site at Marathon, Clermont County, Ohio on November 14, 1998 at 2:00 P. M.

Sons of the American Revolution (S. A. R.), Daughters of the American Revolution (D. A. R.), Children of the American Revolution (C. A. R.), descendants, genealogists, historians, veterans and all interested persons are most welcome to attend.

Speakers will be: Charles Edwards, Revolutionary War Graves Chairman of the Cincinnati Chapter S. A. R. who will give opening remarks; Charles Crawfis, President of the Cincinnati Chapter S. A. R. who will speak about the functions, purpose and activities of the S. A. R.; Brian Schilling, an S. A. R. member and a descendant of Christopher Hartman who will speak about Christopher; and Cindy Johnson, President of the Clermont County Historical Society.

The ceremony will include the dedication of a government veteran headstone and S. A. R. Patriot Grave Marker to the memory of Christopher Hartman.

# **CHRISTOPHER HARTMAN**

(1750 - 1833)

Christopher Hartman was a Private in the Middlesex County, New Jersey Militia in Captain Stout's Company, Second Regiment and pensioned in 1831 with \$80 annually.

He was born in Swintzburg, Hesseccassel, Germany on May 6, 1750 and died on March 15, 1833. He was buried in Hartman Cemetery (Marathon, Jackson Township, Clermont County, Ohio -- U. S. 50 between Monterey and Marathon -- Section 2, Lot 48, Grave 26).

The 1820 census lists Christopher Hartman as head of family in Williamsburg Township, Clermont County, Ohio. He came to Jackson Township in 1801 (Pleasant Run, two miles west of Marathon).

He married Mary Hutchinson August 1776 in Mercer County, New Jersey. She died September 8, 1838 at the age of 83 years, 5 months and 15 days, having been born March 24, 1755.

The children of Christopher and Mary Hartman were William, who married Nancy Cullen who died in 1858; Isaac, who married Mary Daughters in 1807 and she died in 1837; Samuel, who married Sarah Donham in 1814 and she died in 1841 and he then married Elizabeth Browning; Rebecca, who married Adam Bricker in 1805; Elizabeth was born May 22, 1783 near Hightstown, New Jersey, then Middlesex County, now Mercer County and died July 5, 1869 at the age of 86 years, 1 month, 13 days and she married Jacob Roudebush on April 8, 1808; Catherine, who married Ephraime McAdams; Rachel, who married John Page in 1817.
