



SAR High School Essay Contest

The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) invites all high school students (9th–12th grades) to participate in the George S. & Stella M. Knight Essay Contest. The contest is open to all US Citizen and Legal Resident students attending home schools, public, parochial, or private high schools in that same grade range.

To participate, students must submit an original 800- to 1,200-word essay based on an event, person, philosophy or ideal associated with the American Revolution, Declaration of Independence, or the framing of the United States Constitution. Each student's essay will be judged based upon its historical accuracy, clarity, organization, grammar and spelling, and documentation. The contest is conducted in the local, state, and national levels. The contest must be entered through an SAR chapter near the student's residence. In some cases, the contest may be entered at the state. Only one entry per student is permitted per contest year.

The SAR is a 501 C3 nonprofit, nonpartisan organization. Our mission is to honor our Revolutionary War patriot ancestors by promoting patriotism, serving our communities, supporting education , and inspiring future generations about our country's founding principles.
