The Sons of the American Revolution are engaged in a variety of programs to promote the patriotic, educational and historical interest resulting from the American Revolution. Programs include essay contests for both high school students and Eagle Scouts, presentation of medals to college and high school ROTC students, poster contests for elementary school students, presentation of medals to Public Safety officials, dedication of Revolutionary War Patriot graves, and presentation of Flag Certificates to deserving organizations and schools. The group also participates in historic battle site observances and patriotic ceremonies.

A Terror to the Tories, a True Patriot

Colonel Frederick Hambright arrived in the Philadelphia harbor on the ship, St. Andrew, with family members on October 27, 1738, when he was eleven years old. The Hambright's originally settled in Lancaster County, PA. He married Sarah Hardin of Virginia in the early 1750's. Frederick with Sarah's brothers and others traveled the wagon road to North Carolina and first settled at a fort on the South Fork of the Catawba River in the area that became Tryon County, later moving to Long Creek, Lincoln County. Colonel Hambright and his first wife parented six of their twelve children to maturity.

History has recorded numerous references to Frederick's public and patriotic services. An early advocate of American independence, he was a signer of the Tryon Resolve in 1775 and represented Tryon County at the Third Provincial Congress in Hillsborough, August 1775. He entered the Revolutionary War early, in 1777, serving in several campaigns as a Militia officer. At the age of 53, then Lieutenant Colonel Frederick Hambright was commander of the Lincoln County troops, the South Fork boys, at the Battle of Kings Mountain, October 7, 1780. Frederick had three musket ball holes in the hat he wore during the battle and

received a musket ball in his thigh near the end of the battle.

Mary Dover, a young neighbor, cared for him after he was wounded in battle. He recuperated from his wound but would thereafter have a halt in his walk. Frederick and Mary were married the following year on July 17, 1781. The Colonel later built a two story frame house near the historic battleground along the South and North Carolina border at Kings Creek and he was an Elder in the Shiloh Presbyterian Church. The Colonel resided there until his death on March 9, 1817 at the age of 90. The Colonel parented eight of the ten children he fathered with his second wife Mary Dover.
