Locke Patriots

FRANCIS LOCKE - Born in 1722 in No. Ireland. Emigrated with his parents, John and Elizabeth Locke to Lancaster, PA. After his father died in 1744, he moved, ca. 1752, with his mother and brother to Rowan County. In 1759, served as an Ensign in the Rowan militia under Griffith Rutherford. A tavern owner, he was involved in the Regulator disturbance while serving as county sheriff. Served as Lt. Colonel of the Rowan County minutemen in 1775, and as Lt. Colonel of the Rowan County militia under Gen. Rutherford in the "Snow Campaign." Patriot commander and hero of the Battle of Ramsour's Mill. He and 400 men from Rowan and Mecklenburg soundly defeated the Tories in Lincoln County on June 20, 1780. Took command at Colson's Mill on July 21, 1780 after Col. William L. Davidson was severely wounded, leading the Patriot forces to victory. During Greene's retreat through NC after Cowpens, he helped delay the British pursuit by blocking roads and skirmishing at bridges/fords such as Grant's Creek. Served as a Colonel in the NC State Troops. Died January 8, 1796.

MATTHEW LOCKE - Brother of Francis. Born in 1730 in No. Ireland. Treasury Commissioner of the colony of North Carolina, 1771. Member of the Colonial Assembly representing Rowan County, 1771-1775. Member of the Committee of Safety of Rowan County, 1774. Paymaster of Troops, Salisbury District, 1775 and Brigadier General of NC Troops, Salisbury District. Delegate to the Provincial Congresses of 1775 & 1776, and a delegate to the state Constitutional Convention of 1776. He was a "gentleman farmer" who represented North Carolina in the U.S. Congress from 1792-1799 as a Jeffersonian Democrat. Died on September 7, 1801.

JOHN LOCKE - Son of Matthew. Born on August 12, 1751. Served as a Major in the NC State Troops during the Revolution. Died on April 21, 1833.

GEORGE LOCKE - Son of Matthew. Born on September 17, 1752. Served as a Lieutenant in the NC militia (Partisan Rangers) under Captain Joseph Graham of Mecklenburg County. Killed by Tarleton's Legion at the Battle of Charlotte of September 26, 1780, at Kennedy's Farm just north of Charlotte.
