Whose broad stripes and bright stars, thro' the perilous fight,


O'er the ramparts we watch'd, were so gallantly streaming?

Mourn Muskets

Following the playing of Amazing Grace, a black powder gun salute will be fired by the Elijah Clarke Militia. Upon retiring the colors, a solemn tribute to fallen Patriots, Mourn Muskets, will be performed by the Militia. This consists of bringing the muskets to Present Arms with the muskets raised high and the muzzles slowly rotated to point straight down. Next, the elbows are lowered to the sides and then all heads are lowered to the musket butt. After the benediction, the Commander gives a signal to recover muskets.
