Not sure what this means, but I have been making these presentations for about five years. My wife, Pat, who is a DAR and past regent for her College Hill Chapter, often participates in these events with me.

Lecture Topics/Costumes:

Ours are most often simply a review of the time period, using the props from the chest as talking points. We do engage our audiences and often have them take part in the process by handing the items and asking questions as they do so. Pat is a musician and brings a Hammered Dulcimer with her, and plays for the audience and invites them to join her afterward for an up close and personal look at the instrument.

We are both always in costume.
