



### PURPOSE

The purpose of this Work Instruction is to aid volunteer editors of the PRS in transcribing data found in original Record Copies.

### SCOPE

This process should be used by all volunteers editing Patriot records within the PRS.

### DEFINITION

**Annotations** – In our context, annotations are often handwritten corrections and additions the applicant or SAR Staff Genealogists add.

**PDF** - Abbreviation that stands for Portable Document Format. It's a versatile file format created by Adobe that gives people an easy, reliable way to present and exchange documents.

**PRS** – Patriot Research System, the Sons of the American Revolution online research tool for individuals who served or aided the United States during the Revolutionary War period.

**RC** – Record Copy.

**Record Copy** – A scanned copy of an original member application.

**Application Layout** has varied over the decades. In working with older applications, you'll notice that Generation 1 is actually the applicant's parents. In the example below: John Woodard Adams was the application, and under Generation 1, we find his parents, Rollins Theodore Adams and Caselia Free. Be prepared to look at the entire application to find all the information you'll need to complete the transcription.

### B. Annotations on Applications:

The newer the application, the more annotations you will find on an application by the staff genealogists. It is very important that you carefully read each application.

- **Bracketed-Out information:** When you find any information that is bracketed ( 26 Jan ), it means that genealogy has determined the proof documents do not support the information supplied by the applicant. We do not enter any information that has been bracketed out.
- **Corrected and Added information:** You may also find that staff genealogy has added new information. We do want to add those additions to the transcription.

- **Pre-Fix Annotations:** In the example below, you can see that staff genealogy has added three different pre-fixes: **T/S**, **Bur**, and **Abt**. Generally, we see date pre-fixes to the left of the date and location pre-fixes to the left or right of the location field. However, that is not the case in this example. Pay close attention and think about the context of what was added.



**C. Generation Settings:** There are a few settings you need to pay attention to when you start transcribing generational information:

- 1 Include Generation checkbox:** When you'll see that all the generation fields are grayed out, and data cannot be entered into them. Click on the check-box next to the label **Include Generation** to activate that generation.
- 2** In the First Generation only, you need to click the button for **Is Applicant**.
- 3 Relationship:** you need to designate which of the individuals in a generation is the **Son** or **Daughter** of the next generation.

**It is critical** to have the correct relationship selected to relate the generation to the next. If this is wrong, it will create an error in the Descendants search.

### C. Generation Settings:

Even if the Relationship is noted on the **RC**, verify it against the next generation before you make the selection.

- In this example, the applicant has checked the Son as the link to the next generation. However, looking at the next generation, we can see the father, John A Kemp, shares a surname with the wife in generation 6, Martha S. Kemp.
- The application is **wrong**; it should reflect the daughter as the link to the next generation.

- Additionally, we will need to add a Note to Joel Kenney's line to document the error:

**RC Error - Line goes through daughter.**

- What if it's unclear who the lineage parent is? **Don't Guess!** IF there isn't enough information on the Record Copy, don't make a selection.
- Example: Both the husband and wife have the same surname, and the relationship selection wasn't set.

- Prefix** – Generally, we avoid using this field, except when designating a woman as **Mrs**, with no punctuation.
  - We do not use military or honorary titles.
- First** name and nickname for the first name. Separate the names with a forward slash /, no spaces. Example: **Mary/Polly**, **William/Bill**, **Johannes/John**.
  - This field is Required. If no name is listed, add **XX** to indicate no name was present on the application. This includes applications where Generation 1 has no spouse.
- Middle** name or names:
  - Multiple middle names, list all: **Mary Sarah**, **Henry Amos**.
  - If variants are present, separate them with a forward slash /, no spaces. Example: **Mary Sarah/Sally**.
- Last** name – Enter the last name as it appears on the application.
  - This field is Required. If no name is listed, add **XX** to indicate no name was present on the application. This includes applications where Generation 1 has no spouse.
  - Remove spaces in “Mc” surnames: **McDonald**, not Mc Donald
  - When working with maiden names and prior married names, separate them by a forward slash /.

- Suffix** – Generally, we avoid using this field, except when designating someone a **Jr**, **Sr**, or number **III**. No punctuation: **Jr** not **Jr.**
  - Military and honorary titles are not used, such as D.D. or M.D.

#### E. Date Fields:

- Date Format** is the day, month, and year with no punctuation.
  - DD MMM YYYY**
- Multiple Years: enter full years, separated by a forward slash, no spaces.

2. **Place Prefixes** can be added by the applicant or by staff genealogy. In the example below, the individual was last found in the 1850 census living in Bertie County, North Carolina:

- **Place Prefix Format:** do not include a separate forward-slash between the prefix and the city.

### 3. Making Corrections to Place Information.

It may be tempting to correct the information presented or missing from a Record Copy.

- **Missing Information:** Using the above example, you may have personal knowledge that Indianapolis, Indiana is located in Marion County, but the Record Copy doesn't state that fact. Do not add information that hasn't been presented.
- **Spelling Corrections:** If the Record Copy lists a place name that has an obvious misspelling and you are 100% sure it is wrong, then only under that circumstance may you correct it.

Example:

- Culpeper County, Virginia was spelled Culpepper / VA on the RC. We would remove the third P in pepper.
- Cincinnati is misspelled or abbreviated. Indianapolis is listed as Indy.
- Springfield is misspelled Springfiel
- **Document your change.** Place text in the Note field under that individual's information. Use the format shown below.

**G. Notes Field:** The notes field documents any Record Copy errors or special circumstances you encounter for a particular individual or couple. Keep the information short and specific.


